

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

Do you ever hear voices? No, I'm not asking if you're crazy! Unfortunately, we associate hearing voices with suffering from severe mental illness; but great thinkers throughout history have always known that it is quite natural to hear voices.

The ancient Greeks knew about these voices and called them daimon–demons. Halloween conditions us to imagine ghosts and goblins and the like, but the spirits that inhabit each of us actually are voices from our unconscious or from our past.

Thomas Jefferson wrestled with many such voices; and he learned to carry on conversations with them. Like Socrates and many others, Jefferson knew that the voices could either empower or inhibit his ability to make decisions. The trick is to allow the wiser voices to offer counsel and guidance to the more troublesome or seductive ones.

As we celebrate All Saints' Sunday, we remember some voices from our own past, voices that still speak to us and influence who we are and how we behave. The challenge is to find a way for these voices to work as allies in the ministry of our daily life, rather than as detractors.

Michael Beran, one of Jefferson's biographers, writes: "[Jefferson learned] to treat his various voices [good and bad alike] like bright playful children, little prodigies who must be given scope for the expression of their elegant (demonic) energies."

May you listen to the voices you hear this season, and may they help you find the path into God's future that waits just for you.
