

#### NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

"The Kingdom of God is like...."

During the long season between Pentecost and Advent, many of the Gospel readings tell us about life in God's Kingdom. When I was in seminary, this was sometimes referred to as "the sovereignty of God."

"Sovereignty." A big word not often used these days. Perhaps that's why it jumped off the page as I was reading a piece by columnist George Will. "The sovereignty of wants becomes the imperialism of whims," he wrote.

Will is talking about the relatively young people who are newly rich and completely caught up in the electronic culture. "With their cell phones, tablets, laptops, and other high-tech toys....wherever they are, they are the center of the universe, served by gadgets that—like their stock market windfalls—tell them...they can have whatever they want when they want it."

When Jesus suggested that you must become like a child to enter God's Kingdom, this wasn't the childlike trait he had in mind! And yet, haven't we all been affected by the fast-food, "have it your way" culture of our day?

As you enjoy another summer of God's wonderful creation, give yourself time—and permission—to smell the roses. Watch for signs of God's activity in your world—little nudges from the Spirit dwelling within you. Listen for the sounds of the Kingdom in laughter and in tears. Feel the gentle breeze of God's presence wafting over you as you continue on your journey.

How will *you* complete Jesus' intriguing sentence: "The Kingdom of God is like...?
