

#### NOTE FROM THE PASTOR:

In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. (Isaiah 40:3).

Although you would never know it from the decorations in the streets and in the malls, these weeks before Christmas are not about carols and bells and shepherds and stars. Advent proclaims the call to prepare.

Of course if you are like Paula and me, you do spend a good deal of time preparing for Christmas: carrying the advent and Christmas decorations up from the basement, erecting the tree, decorating the house, purchasing gifts, attending parties and dinners.

But the preparation which Isaiah cites is not about getting things ready for the Christmas holidays. It's about preparing *ourselves*. Isaiah implored the people of his time to prepare their lives for the coming of a King, who would lead God's people out of exile, through the wilderness, and back to their homeland.

Can you sense a desert wilderness in your heart? Maybe Advent is the time to nourish yourself with prayer and meditation and the reading of Scripture. Is your life cluttered with too many things to do, and with too much to worry about, and with the needs of too many other people? Maybe Advent is the time to clear the way for God to find a place there.

Whenever Paula and I prepare to host a gathering in our home, we look around and notice the cobwebs and the piles of magazines and general disorder that escapes us during an average hectic week in our lives. We clean and straighten up the place in order to be gracious hosts.

Maybe the best way to observe the season of Advent is to take that kind of an honest look within yourself. What changes will you want to make if you are going to host the King? You know, if you do a little bit every day, perhaps the task won't seem so impossible.

Amazing things can happen when you prepare for the coming of a special guest. May your Advent days be blessed with peace of mind and joy of spirit!
